



BLAT GUIDE

These are some of the blats that we've enjoyed. Most have been planned by our Blat Coordinators Martin and Lynn Whiteley. Many were originally put together some time ago and whilst to our knowledge there have been no changes, LADS can accept no responsibility if you get lost!! Here are a few points to help you enjoy your Blat safely and have fun!

- Make sure you start with a full tank of fuel. These are remote roads with few petrol stations.
- Beware of animals. Many of the roads will have sheep, cattle and horses.
- Drive carefully and sensibly – Hedgerows and walls can prevent others seeing you in a 7.
- Beware that some roads are narrow or only single track with passing places.
- Make sure you close any gates behind you.
- If you picnic, please take all your litter home.
- Look out for cattle grids.
- Beware of speed limits.
- Look out for walkers and hikers.
- Keep the noise down in residential and built up areas, or where there are animals present.
- Be aware that if you plan an organised 'blat' for a group of people you may need to apply for a Certificate of Exemption from the MSA see, <http://www.msauk.org/custom/asp/home/default.asp>
